Language requirements

All non-native students (regardless their nationality) must satisfy language proficiency and submit an official test in English (IELTS 6.0, TOEFL iBT 80, Cambridge 170 or Duolingo 100 minimum) or in French (Level DELF B2 minimum) depending on the program they wish to follow. These are the only tests that we accept. Please note the issuance of the language proficiency tests shouldn't be older than 2 years old at the moment of the application.

For students who have been enrolled in 100% English programs for at least two years at their respective home universities, we accept an official letter from the university stating their English level and that they are enrolled in full English programs as proof.



	French as a Foreign Language course is available to exchange students as a module only in the Study Abroad track program.
Academic requirements	Students should have studied for at least one year in a business or economics related with an average grade of 2.3/4 of the GPA system to enrol in our international programs.

	Before arrival, students must purchase a full health cover for the

Insurance requirements for incoming exchange students	Before arrival, students must purchase a full health cover for the length of their stay.	
	 EU citizens do not need to purchase the health cover but must provide a copy of their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). 	
	Non-EU citizens must purchase private insurance covering their whole period of stay in France.	
	Students will have to submit a copy of their International Health Insurance to PSB IO before start of classes	
Courses and ECTS	The course selection is done once the student is accepted to the program.	
	Students can take a workload from 6 ECTS and up to 30 ECTS per semester (1 course minimum and up to 5 maxima per semester).	
	Acceptance on these courses is subject to academic prerequisites, timetabling constraints and number of students enrolled.	
	The first week of lecture is the "add & drop period" during which any changes must be reported and approved by the PSB IO and the Academic Department. After that, courses cannot be changed or removed and will later appear on the transcript. Around 20% of the courses will be online, and 80% on campus.	



Visa process	All non-EU students coming to Paris School of Business for an exchange program must have a student visa (for stays longer than 90 days). VISA applications should be made through the French Embassy and the closest Campus France agency in their home country.	
Accommodation	Paris School of Business does not provide on-campus accommodation and students must look for housing independently.	
	We send to all accepted students before the start of the semester our Accommodation Guide, where you will find all the necessary information to find accommodation in Paris, as well as the list of our housing partners.	
Approximate cost of living per month	Cost depends on each student, but we consider between 1200.00 and 1500.00 euros per month to live in Paris.	
Orientation Day	Usually held at the beginning of the semester, PSB IO offers an "Orientation Day", where we provide useful information concerning the study program: we will show students Paris School of Business' campus, our extranet and PSB Learn systems and other important things you need to know while studying in France.	
	Please consider that the orientation is mandatory for all international students.	
Transcripts	A soft copy of the transcript of records will be sent via e-mail to the home university. This can take around 10 weeks after the final exam period.
